What is the Resettlement Assistance Program?

Resettlement Assistance Program (RAP) staff welcome **Government Assisted Refugee** (GAR) arrivals at the Fredericton airport. RAP staff assist with the immediate and short term needs of new arrivals, including interpretation and transportation to temporary accommodation.

What do RAP workers do?

In the 4-6 weeks following arrival in Canada, RAP staff support GAR clients to:

- Access permanent accommodations, household goods, and healthcare services;
- Receive orientation to:
 - Mandatory federal and provincial programs (Social Insurance Number (SIN), IFH, NB Medicare, Canada Child Benefit, income assistance)
 - Canadian life skills, culture and society
 - Canada's financial system, bank account and budgeting
 - Housing
 - Public education
 - Public transportation and neighborhood orientation
 - 911 emergency services
 - Canadian healthcare system
 - Rights and responsibilities
 - Children and youth programs
 - Employment supports

Financial support for GAR arrivals

The government of Canada, through the **Resettlement Assistance Program** (RAP), provides financial assistance to GARs for basic needs. The amount of assistance varies depending on the number and ages of family members. GAR families receive income support for a maximum of one year or until they are financially self-sufficient.

Learn English or French

In New Brunswick, we speak English, French, or both. New Brunswick is Canada's only officially bilingual province.

Adults aged 18 years and older will be assessed to find out their level of English, and placed in a MCAF English language class. While parents take language classes, children (age 6 months to 5 years old) are welcome to attend the **Care for Newcomer Children** (CNC) program.

MCAF staff support newcomers to enroll in a free **French as an Additional Language** class offered by the New Brunswick Community College.

RAP staff assist newcomer families to enroll children in school. Newcomers can choose to put their children in either the French or English school system. The MCAF **Settlement Workers in Schools** and **Francophone Liaison** staff facilitate newcomer families' participation in the school community and in MCAF children and youth programs.



Healthcare Support
The **Newcomer Health Worker** facilitates a healthcare needs assessment, as well as orientation and referrals to appropriate healthcare services in the community for each newcomer.



We support newcomers to access:

- NB Medicare coverage, Interim Federal Health (IFH) program, and patient rights
- Emergency healthcare services
- Fredericton Downtown Community Health Center
- Hospital services
- New Brunswick Public Health services
- Mental health and addiction services
- Dentists, optometrists
- Specialized health services in the community and region
 - life in Canada, parenting programs, mental health and well-being
 - health care, government and educational services, etc.

Community Connections

First Fredericton Friends are MCAF volunteers who share their time to help newcomers get settled in Fredericton. First Fredericton Friends introduce newcomers to activities and events in their new community.

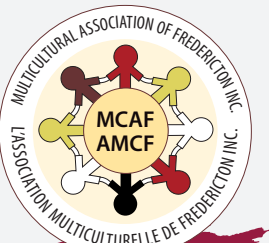
Group Programs at MCAF
